Graduate Student Researcher

The Steven Wallace at the UCLA Center for Health Policy Research has recently been awarded a five-year grant from NIH to study the health of youth (ages 0-17) in Latino families, with an emphasis on mixed status families. We are seeking a 24-50% time graduate student researcher (GSR) to work on this and a related project.

Responsibilities:

- Search the published literature, existing studies, and other relevant sources for needed items and scales for the survey.
- Work with the project team in finalizing and cognitive testing the survey instrument in English and Spanish.
- Assist with quality assurance when the survey is fielded.
- Collaborate in collecting, validating, and cleaning contextual level data.
- Participate in all team meetings as the project develops.
- Potentially collaborate in data analysis and writing on a related project on adult immigrant health.

Qualifications:

- Professional or academic background in public health, public policy, or related social science field.
- Excellent writing and research skills.
- Fluent in Spanish (preference for native speaker of Mexican or Central American “dialects”)
- Strong organizational skills to manage competing priorities and deadlines.
- Familiarity with an online reference manager (Zotero or EndNoteWeb), academic search tools (e.g. PubMed), and standard office software (Word, Excel), etc.
