¹ Low-income food insecurity is defined as percent of adults in the population who had difficulty reliably putting food on the table in the last year and were under 200% of the federal poverty level.

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† Estimate should be interpreted with caution because it is either unstable (coefficient of variation $\geq 40\%$) or it has a wide confidence interval (> 20 percentage points).

Lower and Upper CI denotes 95% confidence intervals for every calculated estimates. This means that the actual value lies between the lower and upper range.

Compared to State denotes estimates of districts that are significantly higher or lower than the overall California estimate.

Blank cells denote no significant difference.
