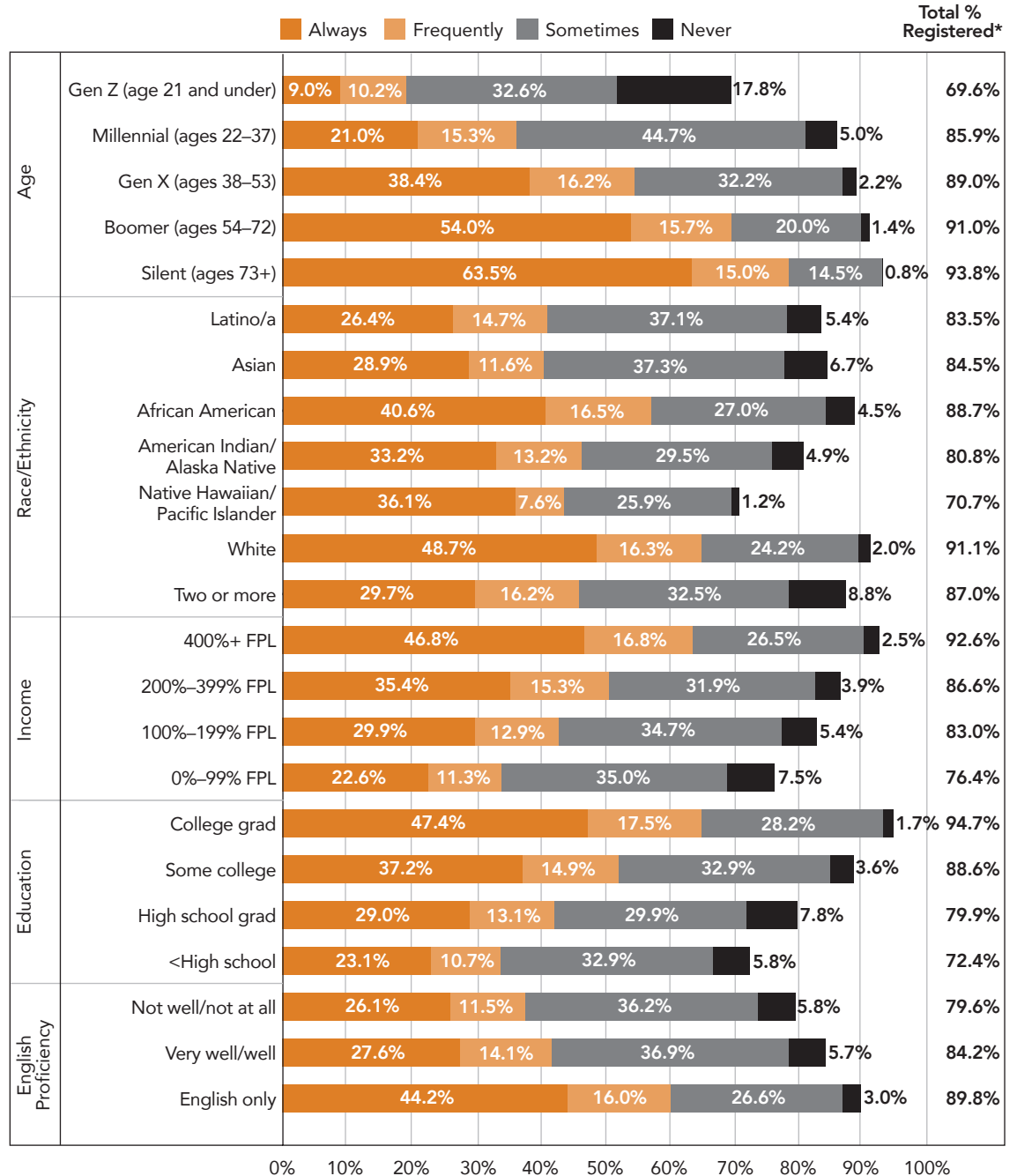

Ages 18 and Over, California, 2017–2018

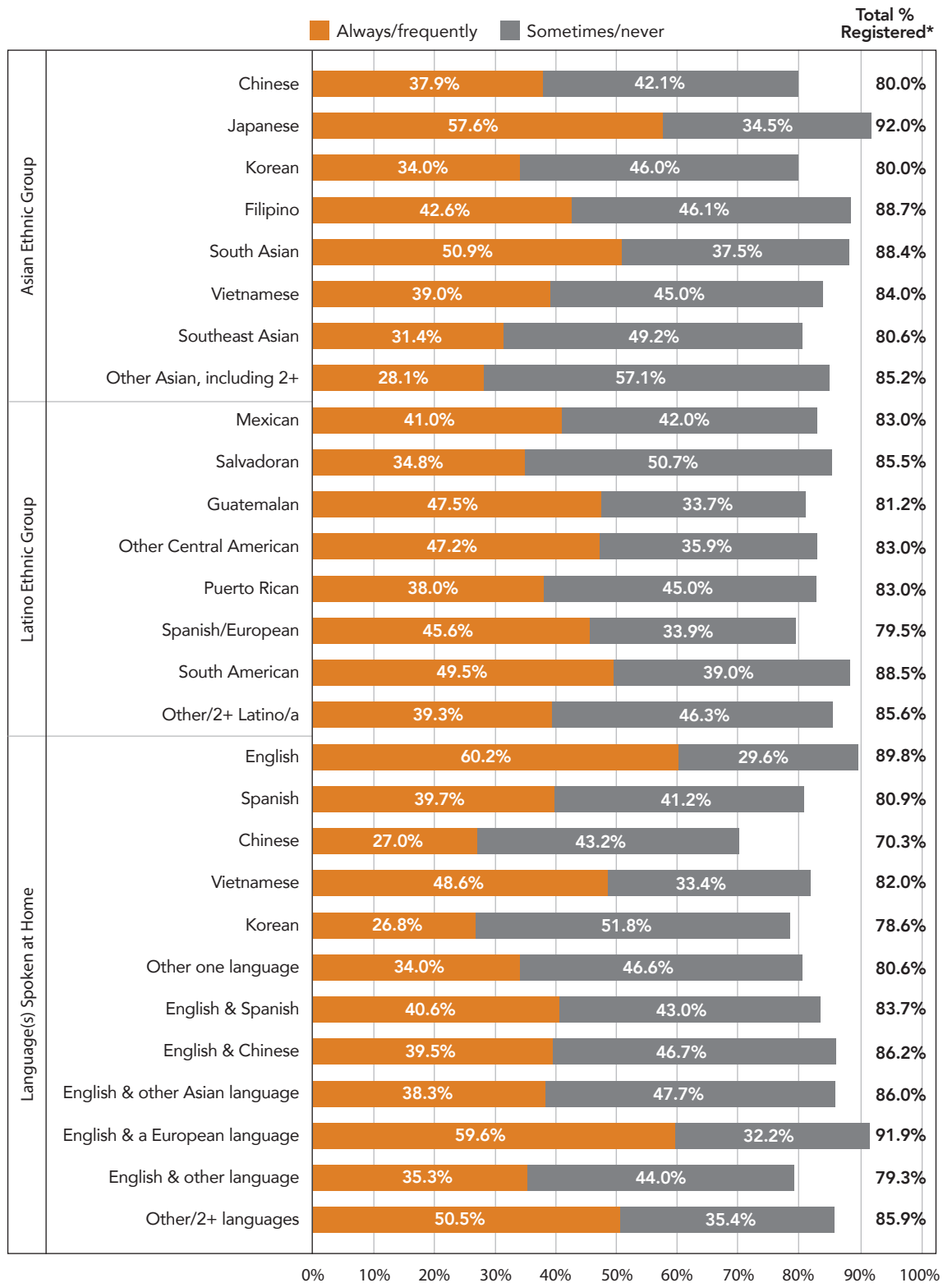

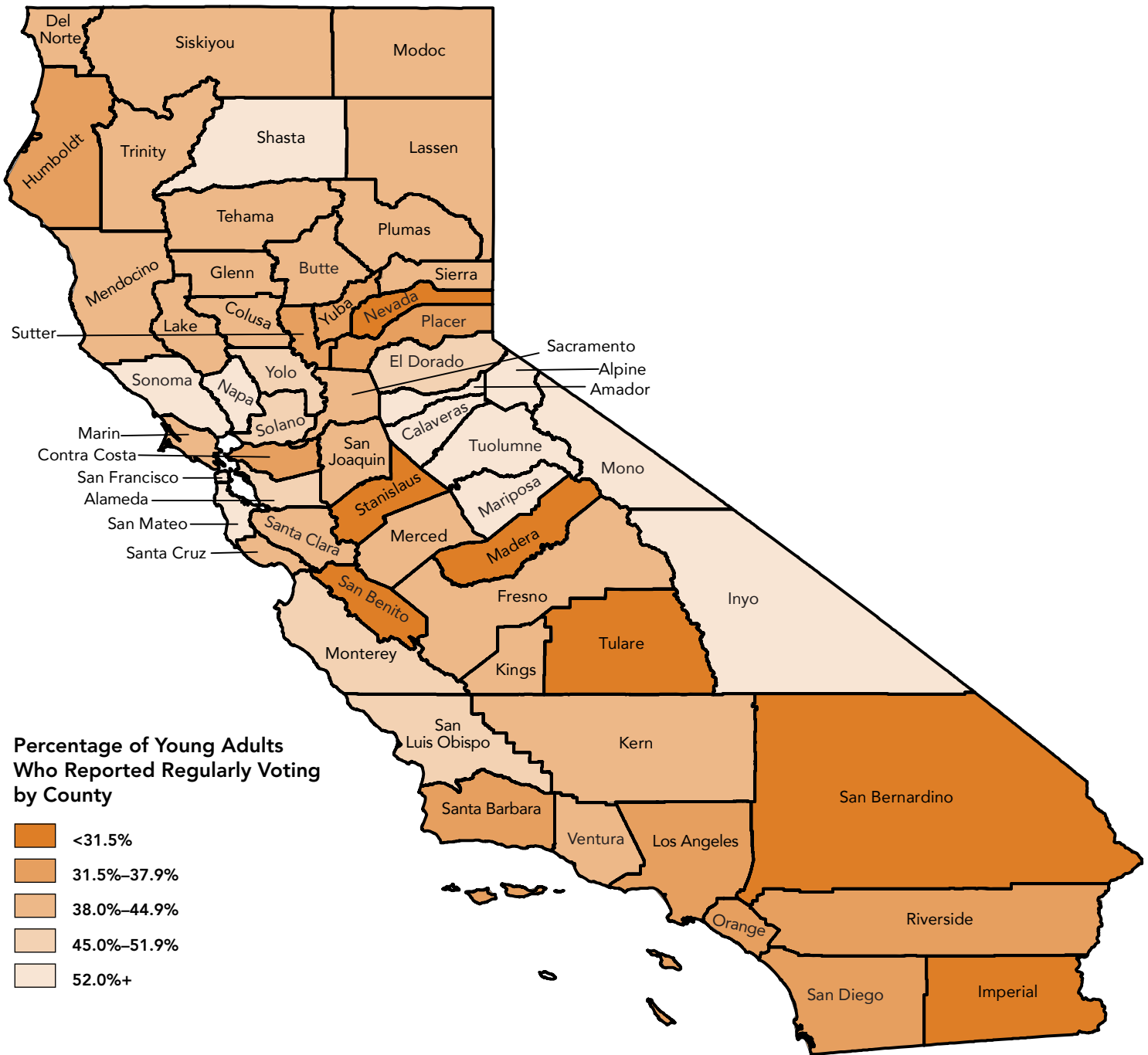

Percentage of Young Adults (Ages 18–34) Who Reported Regularly Voting by County, Registered Voters, California, 2017–2018

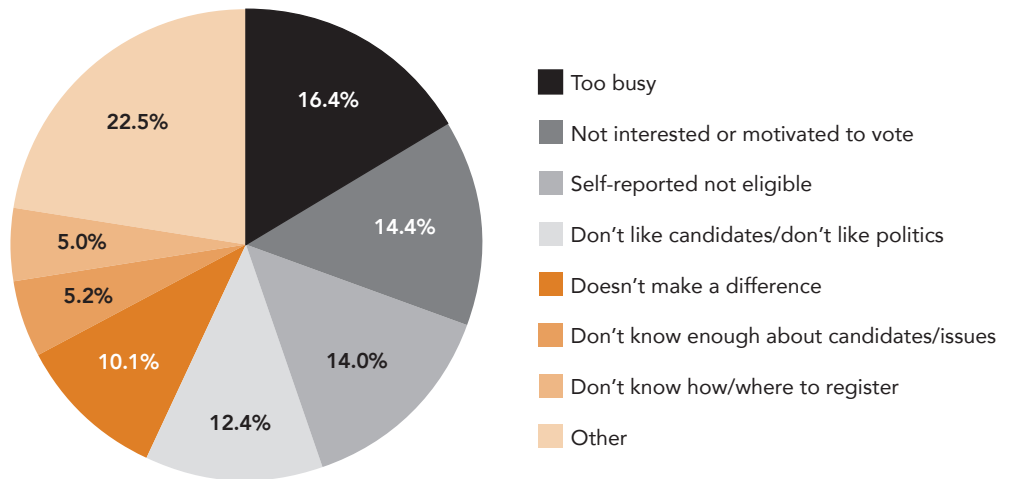
